

Suspected poisoning? Don't wait for symptoms. Call your vet or the **Animal PoisonLine on 01202 509000** straight away. Don't try to make your dog sick unless a vet tells you to. Print this and stick it on the fridge.

● TOXIC FOODS

Chocolate Grapes & raisins
Xylitol (sugar-free gum & sweets) Onion & garlic
Macadamia nuts Alcohol Caffeine
Raw bread dough Blue cheese Corn on the cob
Cooked bones Mouldy food

● POISONOUS PLANTS & BULBS

Sago palm Lily of the valley
Azalea & rhododendron Oleander Foxglove
Daffodil bulbs Tulip & hyacinth bulbs Yew
Autumn crocus Castor bean plant

● MEDICINES & HOUSEHOLD DANGERS

Human medicines are a top cause of dog poisoning, never give any without a vet's say-so:

Ibuprofen Paracetamol Aspirin Vitamin D tablets Antifreeze Rodenticide (rat poison) Slug bait
Vapes & nicotine Cannabis Mothballs Detergent pods Button batteries

● USUALLY FINE IN MODERATION

Plain, unseasoned, and in sensible amounts for your dog's size:

Carrots Apple (no pips) Plain cooked chicken Blueberries Green beans Plain rice Plain pumpkin
Cucumber Watermelon (no seeds) Plain oats

If your dog eats something on the red list

Note **what** they ate, **when**, and roughly **how much**, then phone your vet or Animal PoisonLine (01202 509000).

Acting early, before symptoms show, gives the best outcome. This list covers the most common dangers, not every one, so when in doubt, check with your vet.
